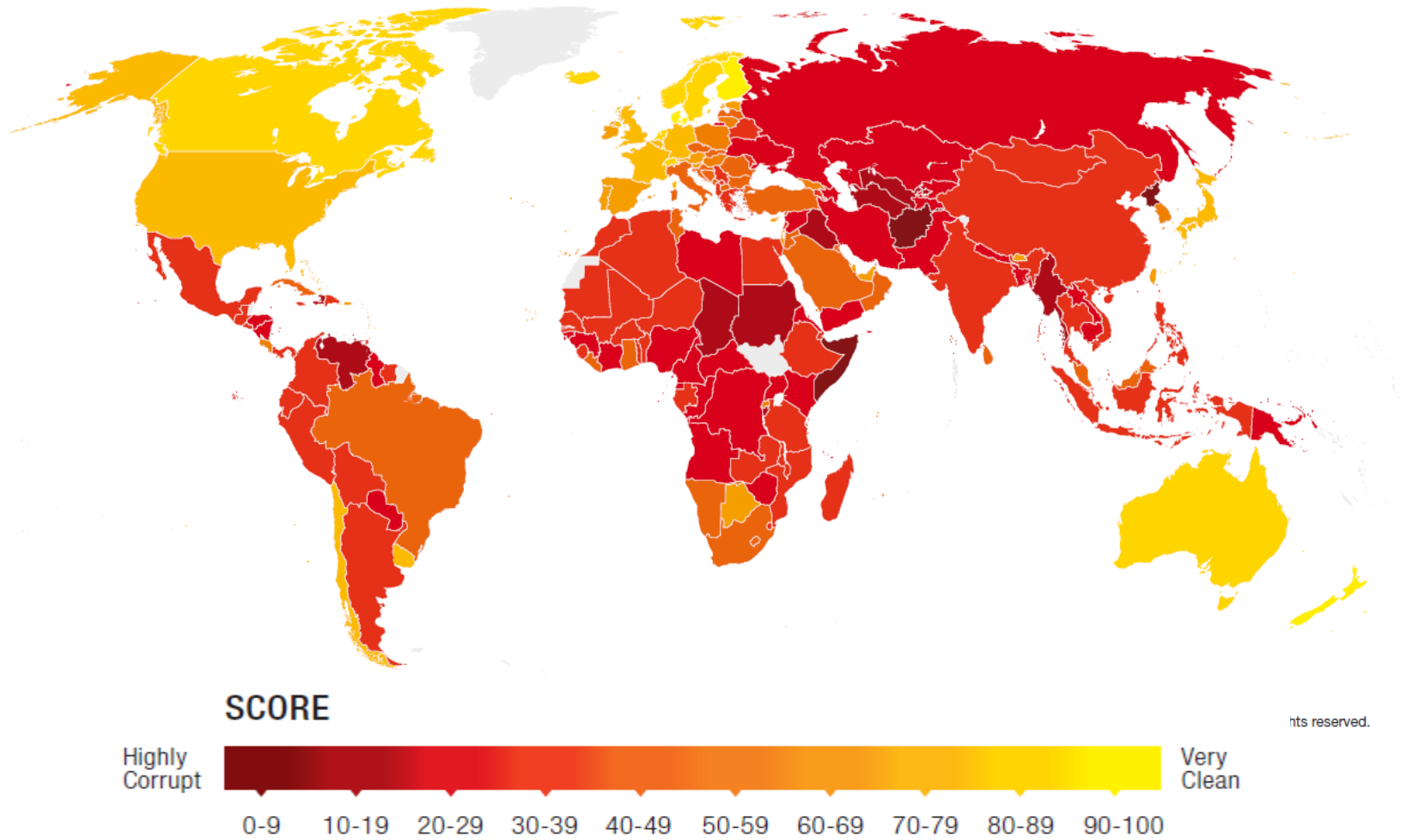

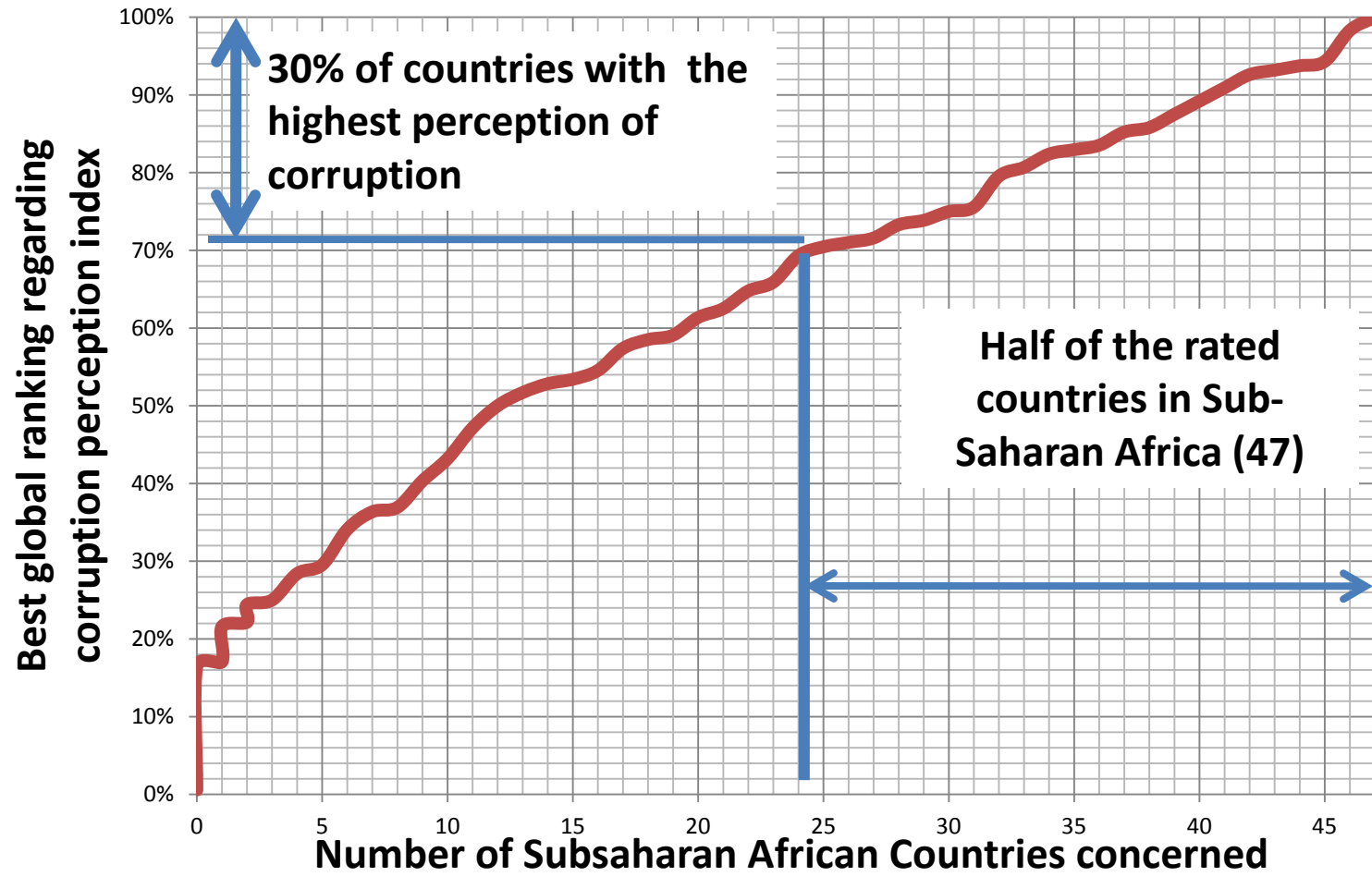

IMPORTANCE OF THIS CONCERN

What about sub-saharan Africa?

- **Sub-Saharan Africa represents more than 40% of the world population who have no access to an adequate drinkable water supply facility**
- **Sub-Saharan Africa is not on tracks towards achieving the goal related to potable water, although some countries have already achieved it (Malawi, Burkina Faso, Ghana, Namibia and the Gambia). Libéria is on the tracks.**
- **12 countries represent $\frac{3}{4}$ of the world population who defecate at the open air. And 6 of these countries are in sub-Saharan Africa: Ethiopia (38 millions), Nigeria (34 millions), Soudan (19 millions), Niger (12 millions), Burkina Faso (9,7 millions) and Mozambique (9,5 millions).**

IMPORTANCE OF THIS CONCERN

343 millions of Africans so far have no access to potable water.

For millions of africans, access to improved water supply facilities is hampered by corruption.

- Lack of supply infrastructure system,
- Uneven repartition of resources,
- Kickbacks and/or collusion between politicians and contractors seeking for avid profits...

THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THE STRATEGY :

- 1. Designing of the course and learning activities, based on the existing Manual**
- 2. Identify trainers (*mentors*) among lecturers and key persons in the water sector**
- 3. Train trainers in tutoring technique related to e-learning**
- 4. Implement training sessions focused on stakeholders at municipalities level (*openness to 2iE students and then to those from other universities*)**
- 5. At least an online « summer » school every two years**
