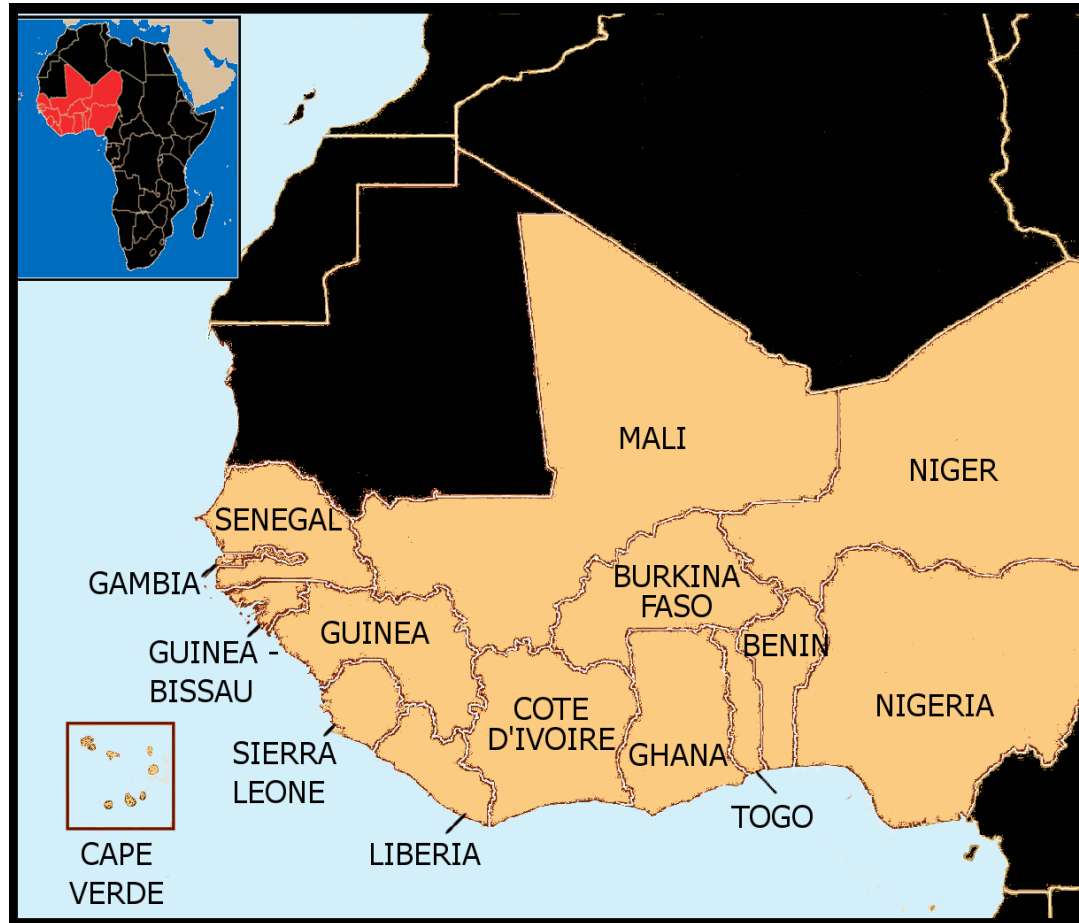

The Approach

- **Cross-fertilization (i.e. different countries, policy-makers, technocrats, CSOs & NGOs, media, etc.) is very key for West Africa owing to the fragmented nature of the countries**
- **Building the capacity of all for effective development and implementation of anti-corruption action plans**



The Approach - 2

- Producing “water integrity ambassadors” to help sustain the awareness and promote the tools, the mechanisms and the approaches in strengthening water governance in general
 - Country/organization action plans prepared
- ➔ How would these action plans be carried through or monitored? *The proposed scorecard
